Men's Head Coach Dave Faucher

Dave Faucher is well known in not only New Hampshire college basketball circles, but throughout the New England region and at the national level. Faucher spent 20 years with the Dartmouth College men's basketball program, serving 13 years as head coach (1991-2004), preceded by seven years as assistant coach.

Faucher has found great success throughout his years as a collegiate head coach. He has utilized a tough, enthusiastic and hard-nosed brand of basketball that has opened the eyes of opponents across the nation.

Women's Head Coach Heather Jacobs

Jacobs is in her second season overseeing the Eagle women's basketball program. A 2006 graduate of Franklin Pierce University, she graduated magna cum laude in Sports and Recreation Management with a minor in Marketing and was a two-time Northeast-10 Conference All Academic selection.

Men's Assistant Coach Chris Dorsey

Dorsey recently completed his first season at DWC after spending the previous three years at Lyndon State College (VT) as an associate head coach. A junior college standout at Alpena CC (MI), Dorsey was a two time team captain, MVP, and Eastern Division Michigan CC Athletic Association all conference selection.

Men's Assistant Coach Vin Sparacio

Sparacio recently completed his second season at Daniel Webster, and was previously an assistant at Susan E. Wagner HS (NY) and Laurinburg Preparatory Institute (NC). A New York native, Sparacio has also coached in the AAU circuit and assisted with camps including Five Star, Harvard Elite and the Hoop Group Invitational.

Women's Assistant Coach Kristen Kunzman

Kunzman joined the Eagles staff in 2008 after enjoying a standout collegiate career at Millersville University where she served as captain, guiding her team to a conference title and NCAA tournament. She has also worked as a counselor and instructor with a number of summer basketball camps in Virginia, Kentucky and Pennsylvania.

Directions to the College campus

Boston and the South Shore
Take Interstate 93 north to Route 128. Take Route 128 south to Route 3 north. Once in New Hampshire look for exit 6. (see below.)

West of Boston
Take the Massachusetts Turnpike (I-90) east to Interstate 495. Take Interstate 495 north to Route 3 north. Once in New Hampshire look for Exit 6. (See below.)

Southern Connecticut and New York
Take Interstate 95 north to Interstate 91 north to Interstate 84 east to Massachusetts Turnpike (I-90 east), then follow to Interstate 290 east. Turn north on Interstate 495 and north again on Route 3. Once in New Hampshire look for Exit 6. (See below.)

North of Daniel Webster College
Take Interstate 93 south to 293 to the Everett Turnpike south to Exit 6. (See below.)

Exit 6
From Route 3 (Everett Turnpike), take Exit 6. Go east approximately 1/8 mile. Turn left onto Blue Hill Avenue and continue 1.1 miles to the entrance of University Drive. Turn right.
